
THAT HOLLYWOOD MOMENT

Last month, Macau dispatched 78 Special Olympics athletes to some 2,000 coaches, along with 30,000 volunteers plus Los Angeles for the World Games, in a delegation comprising 114 people, including coaches, volunteers and unified partners. By the conclusion of the games, the best results ever were achieved, with the MSAR bringing home 89 medals, 35 of them States of America's First Lady Michelle Obama, singers like gold. For the first time ever as a Macau delegation, the golf team, Avril Lavigne, Stevie Wonder, and Colombian Reggaeton with just five years of practice and preparation, achieved fourth position in the delegation, bagging 3 golds and 2 silver medals. During the stirring opening in the Los Angeles Memorial Coliseum, a crowd of 62,338 fans watched 6,500 athletes from Special Olympics athletes and Olympic gold medallists 165 nations march proudly into the historic arena, the largest red carpet in Hollywood history. It was the largest number of nations ever gathered for a single event in Los Angeles even though this city hosted the Olympic Games in 1984:

500,000 spectators in attendance for the Games, with ESPN transmitted the Games live for one hour worldwide. Alongside the CEO of the international Special Olympics and the United artist J Balvin got the ball rolling: fun and integration in a world of abilities rather than disabilities, beautifully delivered with Hollywood's own brand of magical fairy dust. including swimming legend Michael Phelps, diver Greg Louganis and skater Michelle Kwan triumphantly carried the Special Olympics flag together as they marched into the arena and a little bit of history.
